### INTERNET SITE DISCUSSION :

An important item for the Cancer Librarians Business Agenda

## Highlights of the 1997 Annual Meeting-Seattle Cancer Section Program

Last May in Seattle, the Cancer Librarians, with the Consumer and Patient Health Information and the International Cooperation Sections, presented a Section Program titled "Diverse Cultures, Diverse Responses: Meeting the Challenge of Health Information for All." Four contributed papers were presented, which in themselves were diverse in their topics.

"The Diversity of European Medical Libraries: the Unity of EAHIL" was presented by Donna Flake. EAHIL (<http://www.ub.ntnu.no/eahil/>) is the acronym for the European Association of Health Information and Libraries. Donna gave an overview of the organization and invited MLA members to join and attend its annual meetings (1998 meeting - <http://www.med.ruu.nl/eahil.html>).

"Planning for Diversity: Meeting Cancer, Cancer Prevention, and Cancer-Related Information Needs in a Multicultural Environment", by Mary Gillaspay, described a consumer health program and library located within the University of Texas, Houston, Cancer Prevention Center. The Learning Center (<http://rpisun2.mdacc.tmc.edu:8080/prevention/learnctr.htm>) developed its collection, marketing strategies and education activities to address the needs of underserved groups and cut across ethnic, gender and socioeconomic barriers.

With "Building a Health Community with Information-through-Involvement: a Diverse Model for Consumer Health Information and Education," Barbara Carlson ([carlson@musc.edu](mailto:carlson@musc.edu)) outlined a collaborative community program that included addressing the needs of 22,000 disadvantaged persons at high risk for environmental health hazards, infant mortality and a number of chronic diseases. The program includes developing a network of information resources that can be delivered to the community via clinics, public libraries, and other neighborhood settings.

## **Patient Education**

**The Chemotherapy & radiation therapy survival guide** / Judith McKay and Nancee Hirano. Oakland, CA : New Harbinger Publications, Inc., 1997. 226p. ISBN 1-57224-070-9 : 13.95.

Essentially an update to the 1993 edition *Chemotherapy Survival Guide*, this patient education book has also added information on radiation therapy. This is a very readable text with basic explanations and coping suggestions. Helpful information on iv therapy, bone marrow transplants and nutrition are included. The relaxation and stress reduction section concludes with visualization scripts to be used or adapted by the patient. CLW

**Everyone's guide to cancer therapy: how cancer is diagnosed, treated and managed day-to-day**, rev., 3rd ed / Marlin Dollinger, Ernest Rosenbaum, Greg Cable. Toronto: Somerville House Books Limited, 1998. xxiii, 824p., ill. ISBN 0-8362-3709-9 : 21.95.

Newly revised and updated, this guide continues to be the best comprehensive source on cancer information for the public. Clear explanations on staging, diagnosis, treatment and prognosis are provided. Updates include new resources and Internet addresses, advances in treatment techniques, new drug additions to the chapter on anticancer and related drugs, and considerations in genetic risk assessment for hereditary cancers. Highly recommended. CLW

**Living beyond breast cancer: a survivor's guide for when treatment ends and the rest of your life begins** / Marisa Weiss and Ellen Weiss. New York : Times Books div of Random House, 1997. xv, 506p., ill. ISBN 0-8129-2689-7 : 25.95.

The author, a physician and founder of LBBC (Living Beyond Breast Cancer) has written an upbeat, sympathetic book on survivorship issues for breast cancer patients. Covered are such topics as: coping with both the physical and emotional side effects of breast cancer, such as sexuality, fatigue, hair loss and lymphedema; continued treatment options, such as tamoxifen; employment concerns; and usefulness of support groups. Also covered is living with metastatic cancer, controlling pain and finally hospice with continued emphasis on deriving the best quality of life for as long as possible. CLW

### **Basic Texts**

**Principles and practice of radiation oncology**, 3rd ed. / edited by Carlos A. Perez and Luther W. Brady. Philadelphia : Lippincott-Raven Publishers, 1998,xxi, 2341 p., ill. ISBN: 0-397-58416-4 : 225.00. (CD-ROM for Windows or Macintosh ISBN : 0-7817-1690-X: 250.00).

This classic text has been thoroughly updated to incorporate the newest concepts and technologic advances in radiation biology and all aspects of radiation treatment. It has also been expanded to include thirteen new chapters. New areas included in this edition cover pain management, supportive care, palliation, and tissue effects of irradiation. A CD-ROM version of this text (for Windows or Macintosh) will be available in April 1998. The second edition of this text appeared in the 1995/1996 edition of Brandon/Hill. This classic text belongs in all medical library collections. BL

**Cancer of the nervous system**. / edited by Peter McL. Black and Jay S. Loeffler. Cambridge, MA : Blackwell Science, Inc., 1997, xv, 935 p., ill. ISBN 0-86542-384-9 : 275.00

This book presents itself as a comprehensive text of neurooncology, covering benign and malignant tumors of the central and peripheral nervous system. Contents include: diagnosis, treatment, and detailed descriptions of benign, malignant and metastatic disease. Additionally, an entire section is devoted to basic science that covers the principles of molecular and cellular biology of tumor development. Specific chapters are devoted to psychological aspects of brain tumors and the role of psychological support for the patient and his family. The book is extensively referenced and illustrated. Recommended for libraries desiring comprehensive coverage in their oncology collection. BL

**The lymphomas**. / edited by George P. Canellos, T. Andrew Lister, Jeffrey L. Sklar. Philadelphia : W B Saunders Co., 1998, xiii, 581 p., ill., ISBN 0-7216-5030-9 : 175.00.

This book offers the researcher and clinician extensive coverage on the basic science and clinical aspects of lymphomas. Contents include molecular biology, epidemiology, pathology, and diagnosis. Therapeutic aspects are detailed in chapters covering radiation, chemotherapy, bone marrow transplantation, and biologic therapy. An entire section is devoted to Hodgkin's Disease, and the Non-Hodgkin's lymphomas are described in detail. Additional chapters cover paraneoplastic syndromes, lymphoma in pregnancy and the elderly, and disorders that mimic or predate lymphomas. It is extensively referenced. Good choice for any medical library's collection. BL

## **A View from Here : A Cancer Librarian's Perspective from Alberta, Canada**

### **Cancer care in Alberta - Library Services**

**In the province of Alberta, cancer care is a responsibility coordinated by the Alberta Cancer Board (ACB), an autonomous health organization but one accountable to the provincial government. Two main cancer centres in Alberta - one in the provincial capital of Edmonton and one to the south in Calgary - form the core of cancer care. Some cancer services are provided in rural Alberta, but most patients eventually come to one of the main cities. Despite 5 years of healthcare cuts, Alberta's cancer care is a strong and responsive sector of our health system.**

**Provincial cancer library service has improved in recent years, but many challenges lay ahead. My librarian colleague, Linda Harris in Edmonton, and I here in Calgary work to improve our respective cancer libraries, but more money, staff, space, collections and time are needed to carry out our large, north-south mission. We strive to offer responsive, effective library services, and succeed often, but find that trying to "do more with less" is not an approach we want to live with forever. Ultimately, more funding will be required to move matters forward.**

### **Canadian Cancer libraries work together**

**In many ways, Canadian cancer librarians are united in their mission to provide information services to health care professionals and patients. How effective are we in meeting individual goals? This depends on how much emphasis cancer centres across the country place on library services, and on the government policies within the home province. It should be said that Canada does not have any legislation resembling the U.S. Cancer Act (1973), nor a network of libraries like that of NNLM, so information provision in Canada varies considerably.**

**Most cancer centres operate small reading rooms or libraries (or both), and the trend toward greater use of electronic resources for all clients is a constant challenge. As with other health science disciplines, there is a growing emphasis on consumer information, access to digital and print resources for patients and increased demands for alternative/ complementary therapy information.**

Generally, cancer librarians here do much of their own networking by participating in Canada's DOCLINE system, and by gathering informally at conferences. As a means of continuing education and keeping abreast of issues, the local and national chapters of the Canadian Health Library Association (CHLA) are vital sources of assistance as are the association journal *Bibliotheca Medica Canadiana (BMC)* and local websites and newsletters. In addition, the Canadian Medical Libraries Listserv (CANMEDLIB) serves as an invaluable resource for health sciences librarians who want to share information of all kinds, including issues relating to cancer. Several of us also lurk (and even participate) in the discussions on MEDLIB, which are always enlightening.

No formal cancer librarians' interest group exists in Canada, but many of us work together, share resources and expertise over e-mail, phone and fax. Some of us belong to the MLA Cancer Librarian's listserv, and participate in the section's publishing activities. Both Linda Harris and I, for example, contributed to the writing of the 1997 MLA publication entitled "Cancer Resources : A Selected List 1995-1997", an important collection building tool for cancer librarians anywhere.

#### Reliance on NCI and CCS

Canadian cancer librarians rely on the National Cancer Institute of Canada (NCIC) and its American counterpart, NCI, as well as the Canadian Cancer Society (CCS), for information. Indispensable are WWW sites for both NCI and CCS (1), as well as the free print items that can be ordered from those organizations.

The Canadian Cancer Society operates a toll-free 1-888-939-3333 service Monday to Friday where callers speak with health professionals about types of cancer, drugs, clinical trials, cancer treatment and issues pertaining to alternative therapies, coping, emotional and financial support, and where to go for help in the community. The service is accessible across the country during regular working hours, and supplements the information provided by individual cancer centre libraries.

#### Future challenges

Much of the work of the Canadian cancer librarian probably mirrors that of the American cancer librarian. Many of us strive to overcome isolation, our budgetary restraints and the increased demands placed on us in the INTERNET age. With these challenges come the pressures of taking on new roles and new responsibilities in our institutions, and ultimately playing a role in improving health care.

Collection development in the electronic era looms as a large challenge. Canadian and American cancer librarians order many of the same expensive textbooks, and face many of the same issues regarding e-texts, current awareness tools and journal costs. In addition, we utilize many of the same databases for service: MEDLINE, Cancerlit and other MEDLARS resources; PDQ searches through Cancermail/ CancerNet; bona fide cancer sites on the WWW, such as Oncolink and the American

**Cancer Society.** The ongoing challenge is to balance evidence-based standards of cancer care from anywhere in the world with a uniquely Canadian perspective.

**DOCLINE** has brought many cancer librarians from Canada and the United States together for the first time. Access to specialized journals in either country can now be readily accessed by contacting the closest cancer centre in either country. Though North America is vast, **DOCLINE** can make it possible for us to work together and continue to improve service now.

The key to our futures seems to be in opening the dialogue between our two countries and sharing resources, know-how and information. Ultimately, Canadians and Americans can share in a collective goal of improving the health and the lives of patients and family members, wherever they may be.



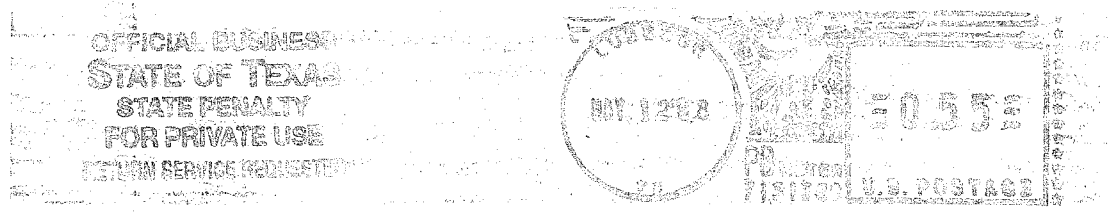
